

# This month's Genealogy Club presentation


On Saturday,



New York state can be a challenge when it comes to tracking down records. Thanks to the folks from NYG&B, there's help! This two-volume set is one of the first places I go when I'm researching New Yorkers, especially if it's a part of the state I haven't researched before. Volume I walks you through all the various record types, describing what's available on a statewide basis. Volume II is the gazetteer; geographically arranged by county, it gives the specific rundown on which materials are available and

where they reside. Included is important information about the history of the county, with changes in borders over time and any possible record loss. Also helpful is the list of various repositories and historical societies that may be of assistance for that really local knowledge.

Those of you who live nearby may want to come in and use our copy, others may even want to invest in their own copies, as it is still in print and available through NYG&B.
