


Thanks for Making Our Annual Fund Drive a Success!

Because of this, our "new" books list will include titles that aren't actually new, but are newly catalogued.





Being in an older typeface, we were not able to produce a successful OCR, but the book has its own index so you can just use the page number dropdown to flip to the back and look your person up there. To find it, go to the category Military, then Books: Colonial Wars. The index begins on page 550. (Note: the data is presented in 2-page spreads, so be sure to click on the next page as well.)

Perhaps you've seen Al Fiacre's great presentation on using periodicals in genealogical research. Unfortunately, we often have to remind ourselves about this important resource; no sense in reinventing the wheel! This handy compilation has gathered important NEHGS *Register* articles on Connecticut families all in three volumes, so you don't have to scramble to find indexes and then wander the stacks in search of individual issues. The introduction is written by Gary Boyd Roberts and sketches out history of periodical coverage of Connecticut families. A very helpful set of books.
