

American Marriage Records Before 1699 -- William Montgomery Clemens

This title is one that is indexed by the AGBI. While the introductory material doesn't cite the original source(s) of the information, Clemens was a well-known genealogist in his time, and was the editor of *Genealogy: A Journal of American Ancestry*. He wrote for newspapers and authored over 70 books, including several biographies and even a couple of books of humorous verse. Whether or not he was the nephew of Samuel L. Clemens (aka Mark Twain) seems to be a matter of contention. Searching online, one can find relatives of William who swear both ways: yes, he was Twain's nephew, no, that was wishful thinking on the part of descendants who hoped they were related. If

anyone out there has more insight than we do in this matter, let us know!
